painfully demonstrates the tragic consequences of the exploitive use of power. The oppressive assertion of dominance of one culture over another also resulted in the Canadian legacy of residential schools and a broken relationship between Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal peoples. There is a need for healing. There is a need for truth-telling and listening. There is a need for reconciliation.

What does reconciliation look like between Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal people? This is the question before the church and all Canadians as the Truth and Reconciliation Commission continues its mandate. This moment in Canadian history has the potential to transform the relationship between Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal people from the paralysis of the impacts of five centuries of colonialism.

We are each made in the divine image, but that image is not homogeneous. National Aboriginal Day celebrates Aboriginal teachings and culture, and invites us to experience God's love for creation in humility and as it is expressed by our Aboriginal sisters and brothers.
