"We sat down and wept"

It was while leading my first funeral service that I became aware of what role the carpet and ceiling panels play in a funeral home — they absorb all the sounds of weeping made by the family and friends who gather.

It was while holding another funeral service in the church I serve that I truly realized how much was being muffled in the funeral home. In the church there was no chance of quieting the one who suddenly broke down and wept, and thank God there was no carpet to muffle her cry.

There was also one other important difference I noted — I could hear the people sing out. The unforgiving wood floors and wood walls of the sanctuary passed the sounds around, allowing us to weep together and sing out hymns of praise that reminded us of God's hope and salvation.


