

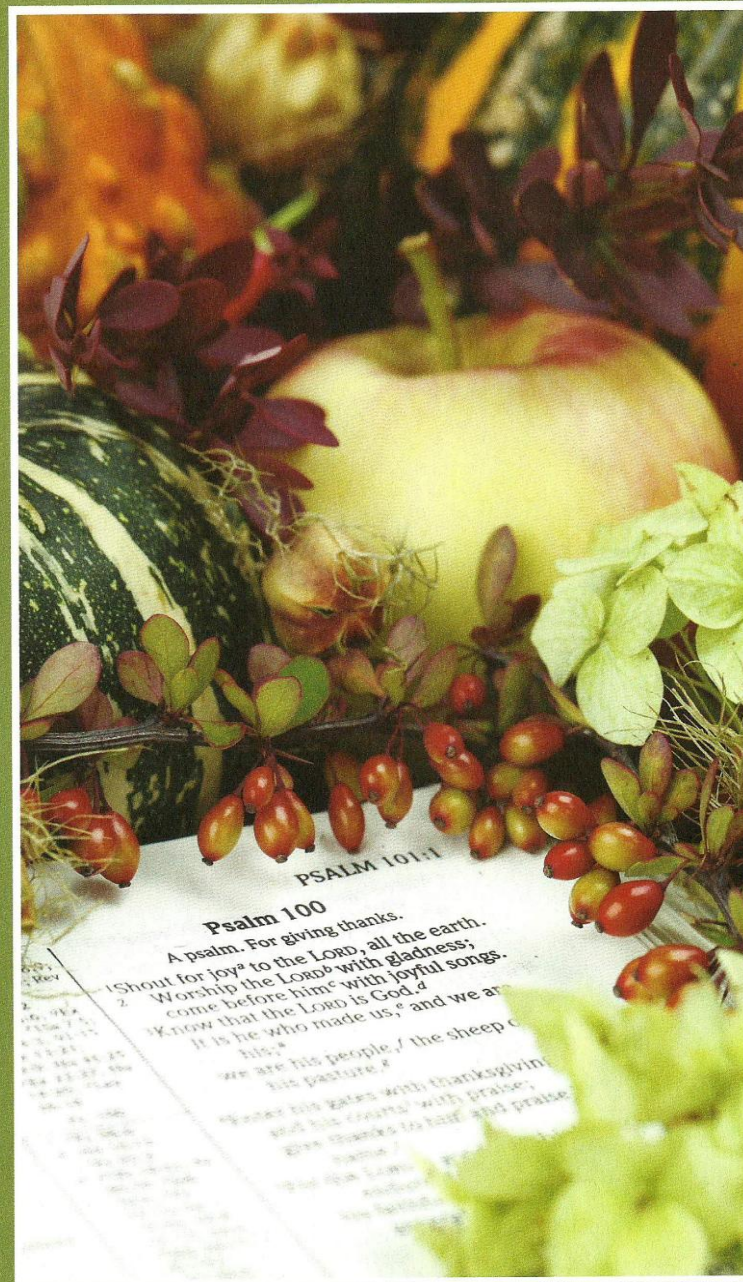
I am drawn with great delight

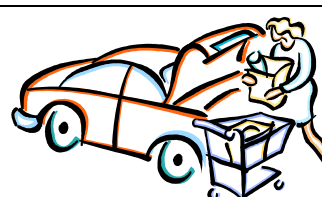
