Courage and Comfort

In December 1942, Norm married his sweetheart, Helen. A few months later, Norm was shipped overseas and fought with the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders. Helen and Norm lived a lifetime in the hundreds of letters that they wrote to each other.

While leading a company of soldiers in an offensive in February 1945, Norm was hit. Several days later, Helen was told Norm had been killed. Overseas, Norm's comrades grieved. In Canada, Helen and her family and Norm's family grieved.

In the book of Haggai, God says, "take courage." Paul writes in 2 Thessalonians, "the Lord Jesus Christ comfort your hearts." Courage and comfort came to Norm's comrades through the words of Presbyterian Padre Captain Charlie Maclean, and to Helen through her loving family, her church family and her faith in Christ.

Today we remember and pray for Canada's veterans, their families, those who serve in the military, and the chaplains who work with them.
