"King of Kings! And Lord of Lords! And He shall reign forever and ever..."


Handel's *Messiah* brings to mind the image of a triumphant Christ, "Christ the King," who triumphs and reigns in glory.

<u>Treasurer's Report to End of October 2013</u>

The following table shows the income to the end of October 2013. The total revenue for the operating fund is down by \$13,500 from this time last year. Part of this difference is due to not having to raise money for the heating system (\$9,260 raised last year). The Presbyterians Sharing budget is only down by \$558 from where we should be and the Special projects budget has been exceeded by \$940.

On the expenditures side our operating costs this year to the end of October are down \$17,270 from last year when we had to pay for the new boiler system (\$20,809). We have not yet received rent payments from Bell Canada for the tower space.

I would ask everyone to consider increasing their givings to the Operating Budget (first box on envelopes) and to Presbyterians Sharing (second box on envelopes) for the remainder of this year as we have a ways to go to make our Operating Budget and a small deficit to meet our Presbyterians Sharing allocation (we have met our Presbyterians Sharing allocation for many years now except for one year).
