Live in peace

2 Corinthians 13:11–13 has three references to peace. The need for the peace of Christ is just as important today as it was for Paul. It implies that brokenness is healed and that we live in right relationship with God and with each other.

The call to live in peace is especially poignant on Aboriginal Day Sunday. Walking with our Aboriginal neighbours is a daily journey. But today we celebrate the unique place of our Aboriginal sisters and brothers in Canada, while we acknowledge a history of brokenness and the particular need for peace within the relationships between Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal people.


We have a great deal to learn from Aboriginal people. Take time to listen to Aboriginal leaders and Elders. Visit an Aboriginal community. Invite a speaker to your church. The fabric of Canadian life will shine more brightly as we come to understand how the "God of love and peace" lives with all people.
